REORGANIZATION OF THE CABINET

This Dominion Ministry is just now undergoing reorganization. It is in the nature of things that the Personnel of a Government must, from time to time, undergo changes.

One of the objections raised by the Opposition to Mr. Tupper's appointment is that he is too young. If that be an objection, it is certainly one for which he is not to blame.

The Opposition press, led by the Toronto Globe, considers the occasion afforded by these Cabinet changes not inopportune to inform the public that the Government of Sir John Macdonald is rapidly going to the dogs.
