The jury was out just 30 minutes. When the Court, convened this morning Richard Muir made the closing speech for the prosecution. He declared that the Crown had proven beyond a reasonable doubt that the body found in the cellar of the Crippen home was that of the doctor's wife. No one else he said, had a chance to murder the oman and bury the body as it was ound to have been buried. Lord thief Justice Alverstone immediately egan his summing up of the case he Justice described Crippen as an extraordinary man, whether guilty or innocent. If guilty he had covered up a ghastly crime in a ghastly way nd it was carried out in a most brual and callous manner.
