**U.S. TRADE.**  
WASHINGTON, Jan. 21.—Foreign trade in 1920 was the country's highest in the country's history. Exports valued at \$13,507,000,000 and imports at \$12,228,000,000, according to figures published today by the U.S. Department of Commerce.

**DISARMAMENT.**  
WASHINGTON, Jan. 21.—The United States Commission on Disarmament today voted to support the proposal of the League of Nations to initiate a general conference on disarmament.

**IRISH LEADER.**  
LONDON, Jan. 21.—The Irish leader, Eoin Boland, today announced that he would accept the terms of the Anglo-Irish Treaty.

**TIME IN TOLEDO.**  
TOLEDO, Ohio, Jan. 21.—The time for the trial of the man who shot and killed the mayor of Toledo today was postponed until next week.

**THEM EMPLOYMENT.**  
MONTREAL, Jan. 21.—The unemployed workers of Montreal today held a demonstration in front of the city hall.

**FIRE CLOSED.**  
WASHINGTON, Jan. 21.—The fire in the Senate chamber today was closed after the burning of the records.

**TURKS CELEBRATE.**  
CONSTANTINOPLE, Jan. 21.—The Turkish people today celebrated the anniversary of the founding of the republic.

**MORE MURDERS REPEATED.**  
DUBLIN, Jan. 21.—Eight men, seven of whom were constables, were shot and killed in a shooting in Dublin today.

**CANADA'S SECRETARY OF STATE DEAD.**  
OTTAWA, Jan. 21.—Hon. A. L. Sifton, Secretary of State, died here at 8:15 this morning.

**AMBUSH AVERTED.**  
DUBLIN, Jan. 21.—Information was obtained by the police this morning that an ambush was being prepared at Tolka River Bridge, on the Droicheadra, from line two miles from the centre of the city.

**MRS. HARRISON RELEASED.**  
BALTIMORE, Md., Jan. 21.—Mrs. Margaret Harrison, of Baltimore, newspaper correspondent, imprisoned as a spy by the Bolsheviks at Moscow, has been released.

**WILL BE FED.**  
MONTREAL, Jan. 21.—The announcement that the real unemployed and needy of the city would be given meals at a city refuge both day and night and that the unruly element, which has been fomenting disorder here will be checked, was made this afternoon by E. D. Dacon, Chairman.

**STILL WINNING.**  
EDINBURGH, Jan. 21.—The Canadian Curlers to-day resumed their victorious tour of Scotland, with a win over East Fife by 123 to 53.

**DE VALERA'S APPEAL.**  
DUBLIN, Jan. 21.—Eamonn de Valera in a message to the Irish people, appeals to them to remain "steadfast in the republican cause."

**TURKS CELEBRATE.**  
Abdul Effendi, heir apparent to the Ottoman throne, gave a dinner on Wednesday night in celebration of the victory claimed by the Turkish Nationalists over the Greeks in Asia Minor, south east of Brusa.

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**MORE TROUBLE IN FIUME.**  
TRIESTE, Jan. 21.—Some of the military forces in Fiume have mutined and they together with supporters of Professor Zanella, leader of the Italian people of the city, have been engaged in fighting.

In Asia Minor was most satisfactory. Recent despatches stating Turkish Nationalist army has entered Brusa, fifty-five miles east of Constantinople, had no foundation in fact, it was said.

**ANOTHER REPRISAL.**
