Sea Surgery.

A MID-OCEAN OPERATION.

On the arrival of the Aberdeen at Cape Town the surgeon gave an interesting account of a difficult operation performed at sea. When the vessel was five days out from London, Mr. Mason, the ship's barber, consulted the medical officer, Dr. William M'Mullan, who immediately diagnosed his complaint as appendicitis in one of its most dangerous forms. Dr. R. E. Wefall, of the hospital, a passenger on the vessel, was called into consultation, and it was decided that an immediate operation was necessary to save the patient's life. The captain gave orders for the vessel to be stopped, and the operation was successfully accomplished in the ship's hospital, and on arrival at Cape Mr. Mason was sufficiently recovered to be allowed to leave the bed.

Peace Hath Her Revels.

HAMBURG. (Associated Press.) Plans are now afoot to convert Hamburg, the dismantled German fleet into an international watering place and a center for regattas and sports. A company with large capital is organizing a scheme which will include extensive beach improvements and establish regular transportation routes between Hamburg and Bremen. It is expected that the enterprise will appease the dissatisfaction of the landers and put an end to the secession movement.

Sawing Through a Baby.

BOY'S MAD PRANK. Stifled cries coming from an upstairs house caused Mrs. Brown, of Adams street, to run to the spot. There she found her two young sons engaged in sawing through a box in which they had placed their baby sister. Snatching the saw from the hands of the alarmed mother, she rushed to the baby. Fortunately it was unharmed, though the saw had scored its way through the baby's clothing. The boys had seen a performance at a local playhouse the previous night in which a woman was locked in a box which is then sawed through without harm to the woman. Mrs. Brown dealt with them in a manner which will cause them to remember the incident for a long time to come.

The Great War.

NEW PIECE OF INFORMATION. Sir William Noble, president of the Burns Club of London, proposing "Imperial Forces" at the Burns Federation dinner in Dunfermline last week, spoke from personal association with the Navy at Rosyth during the war of the admirable services rendered by the Navy. Claiming credit for the telegraph service, of which he is the engineer-in-chief, he imparted a piece of information, which, he said, had not been disclosed. On the night the war was declared, he said, a cable ship left Dover under sealed orders, and by breakfast time the next day she returned to Dover, having every German cable in the sea (he heard). Ten hours after the declaration of war the Germans could not send a telegram outside of their own kingdom (he heard, and applauded).

Savages With Tails.

Do men with tails exist in the known world? Dr. Carl Linnaeus, a distinguished American explorer, declares that such people exist. He has just returned from ten years' unknown parts of Borneo where he says that he found several members of savage tribes with tails of tails. "These people," says Dr. Linnaeus, "are evidently the outcome of inter-marriage with a completely tailed race, because, according to statements by headmen of the tribes, these children with vestige of a tail appear from time to time. They do not consider their appendages exactly a disgrace; nevertheless, they are extremely sensitive about them, and had difficulty in persuading them to allow me to examine them."

Your Hair Has Muscles.

While the expression "hair stands on end" is merely a figure of speech, the fact remains that this is one of the involuntary effects of sudden terror. Such reaction cannot be controlled except by a prolonged effort of the will for they are the natural way in which certain muscles of the body act under certain influences. Each individual hair has a tiny muscle at its root, which, in the ordinary way, keeps the hair lying flat on the head or in whatever position we have trained it to grow. The sensation of fright transmits a message to the brain to these muscles, and they pull tight, causing a feeling on the scalp as if the hairs were standing bolt upright. In the case of short-haired animals the hairs will rise at the slightest provocation—a provision of Nature which enables them to appear larger than they really are, and thus frighten their enemies.

Sir Oliver Lodge on Seeing It Through.

Existence is surely as large and magnificent now as it will ever be in the future; the universe is a going concern. Existence, yes, magnificent enough; but not our individual existence—not yet! The realities are all there, it is we who must attain to them. We can only do so by tiding our time. There is no short cut, there is no hurrying the eternal process. Our spirits must work out their appointed destiny; and the period spent in a material body is a valuable and helpful contribution to the progress of the soul."

"That is why we must see it through; suffering pain if it must be, loss and suffering and bereavement if they come; secure that the end will justify all the labour and travail which precedes it."
