Scientist Discusses

PROBABILITY OF LIFE ON VENUS.

BOSTON.-The existence of life on the planet Venus may be considered highly probable, Dr. Harlow Shapely, director of the Harvard Observatory, said in a recent lecture here. He added that the question of life on Mars was controversial, but that its small mass and its great distance from the sun counted heavily against the probability of life there. "Venus," he said, "is comparable to the earth in many ways and if, as is likely, living organisms develop wherever conditions are suitable over a sufficient interval of time. then it may be considered that life on Venus is highly probable. On no other bodies in the solar system, however, are conditions at all favorable for the existence of protoplasm." Dr. Shapley said that accepting the tidal evolution theory of a planetary system, even for stars otherwise favorably located, an encounter of just the right sort with Mussolini Remembers birth of a planetary system. "And once such a family is born," he continued other stars must not disturb the family, and the star's light intensity must precede animate origins.

OTHER LIVING EARTHS.

"Nevertheless, it appears probable va that among the thousands of millions of stars, there are here and there planets that conform to the requirements. Although the animal man is probably not duplicated in the universe, there are doubtless numerous other living earths, and the chance that their life phenomena surpass in intricacy and highness' those on the earth is as good as the chance that they fall below our level." The search for habitable worlds, he said, was largely a search for conditions suitable for the existence of water in a iquid form. This, he added, was an bsolute necessity for the develop ent of life such as that on the earth, or air, land and water also was no cessary.
