Memories of Gallipoli

DARING EXPLOIT OF A BRIGADE-MAJOR RECALLED.

Many stirring memories of the Gallipoli campaign were recalled at a lecture given in London by Col. H. M. Farmer, D.S.O., of the Lancashire Fusiliers. General Sir George F. Milne, who presided, stated that the Turks had the greatest admiration, and strangely enough, the greatest love, for the British soldier. They understood that they had been thoroughly beaten on the peninsula and, although the Allies did not get through, the Turkish losses must have been enormous. Colonel Farmer declared that the landing at Gallipoli was carried out in accordance with naval ideas, which were opposed to the principles of military tactics. In regard to the attack, there was supposed to have been great secrecy, but during the preliminary preparations in Egypt, so much was found out by the secret service of the enemy that the reports that reached the German headquarters in Athens were extraordinarily accurate. The Turks were even in possession of the names of regimental officers, as indicated after the landing, when two colonels were called by name one night and shot dead in the darkness. Sufficient attention, he continued, was not paid to the details of organization, and the private soldier had to carry a total weight of 85 lb. He mentioned in this connection that in the recent Turkish Greek operations, the commander's policy was to allocate two men to carry necessities with each rifleman; in this way the Turks had a light time, and easily defeated the Greeks. Retelling incidents of heroic endeavor, Colonel Farmer made particular mention of the feat of Brigade-Major

Franklin, who, leading a flank attack, was first at the top of the cliff, and, surprising the Turks, seized the rifle of the nearest man, and shot dead seven of the enemy, and thus creating the demoralization that gave success to that particular movement. The speaker also paid a tribute to the wonderful signalling of the Post Office personnel, and characterized the 2nd Royal Fusiliers as a "wonder" battalion. Several times after being severely mauled, the latter sorted themselves out, junior officers were moved up, and the new commanding officer carried on just as his predecessor. There was not a shadow of shakiness in the whole battalion throughout.

Balkan States

NOW RELIEVE TOURISTS OF ALL SURPLUS CASH.

Athens, Nov. 1. (A.P.)—Currency is so distressingly scarce in all the Balkan states, that not a single government will permit a traveler, no matter what his nationality, to carry away with him more than the government concerned thinks he needs to get him to his next stopping place. In most cases this is 1,000 units of whatever the currency may be; anything over this sum is confiscated. This means the owner of the money will never see it again, and the procedure is legal for the law making it so is down clearly in the statutes of virtually every country of southeastern Europe. The despoiled individual has no recourse.

Many naturalized Americans, natives originally of some Balkan country, have come home since the end of the war bringing with them wealth in dollars. Now they are beginning to get enough of the old country, and again turn their faces to the new world. Their dollars meantime have been exchanged into drachms, or dinars, or lei or lvy, and they want to carry away what is left. But the government says no; only 1,000; the rest stays here.

Thereupon the naturalized citizen turns to the nearest American diplomatic representative and claims protection. The situation presents so many difficulties that the American ministers to the Balkan states have met in conference to discuss what best to do. They are warning all citizens, and particularly naturalized, not to come over here with more money than they actually need. Also they may take the matter up with Washington.

Devolution

WARNS AGAINST PRACTICE OF TRANSPORTING GLANDS.

Buenos Aires, Nov. 1.—The practice of monkey gland operations, should it be extended and carried down the generations, may change man back into the monkey from which he evolved, warns Professor Clementi Onelli, director of the Buenos Aires Zoological Garden, in an article published in the Bulletin of the Sarmiento Society for the Protection of Animals. Moreover, removing these glands from monkeys is cruelty to animals.

Professor Onelli appeals to the local society to call an international congress of organizations for the protection of animals not only to take steps to stop "this new form of scientific cruelty," but "to avoid the alteration of the natural laws of human society with its consequent danger to modern civilization."

"In the desire to postpone as long as possible the decrepitude of age," Professor Onelli writes, "the time may come when the substitution of the secretions of such inferior animals as monkeys, will become more widely practiced, and so many monkey-men produced that, after a few generations, the characteristics of the human species would show variations. The forehead might become flattened, and should the scientists succeed in combining the secretions of the orang-outang with the chimpanzee, for substitution in man, a genus of satyr might result."
