It is with feelings of pain that we have chronicle the death of our esteeme fellow-townsman, whose well-known nam heads this column. The injuries he received on Monday morning last, whilst driving to his office in town, were of so violent a character that they have proved fatal, and this morning at six o'clock his naturally robust and vigorous frame succumbed. His skull was severely fractured and his head dreadfully muti lated; and the wonder was that he was not instantly killed.
