TEARS IN COURT.

Wanton Women Who Were Found in a Club Room.

With the Aid of a Lawyer They Sought the Magistrate's Heart and Got Off.

Jennie Riddle and Elizabeth Murray, the two young women who were found in a King street club room at 1 o'clock one morning last week, were up on remand at the Police Court this morning. Both of these women are entitled to write "Mrs." before their names, but as a marriage was a failure in their cases in the widest sense of the word, they prefer to be known as plain Jennie and Elizabeth. Otherwise they were not plain, but decidedly good looking and well dressed. Riddle is the wife of a physician, but is not hampered by matters matrimonial to any great extent, and during the summer she cut quite a dash on the streets with her dark eyes, dark brown dress and black hair, curled short a la mode, except in rainy weather, when the curls lost their accustomed kinks. She lives in London West with her mother, who bailed her out last week. Murray, who travels under her maiden name, had been in jail a week. She is the wife of an ex-hotel-keeper's son, and like her consort she shook off the marriage ties some time ago. Eighteen months since she left town at the request of the magistrate and on suspended sentence. This morning they appeared smilingly to one another until the magistrate appeared, when an effort was made to start the tears, but Murray was the only one to succeed.

The chief was boiling over with indignation last week and wanted the remand made in order to suspend the young men who took the girls into the club room. Time evidently softened his feelings or else he thought that "expulsion from the club was punishment enough for the giddy young.
