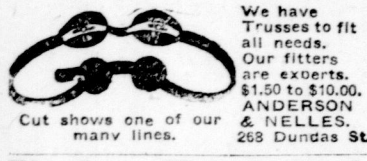

MEIGHEN ATTENDS HIS FINAL DUTIES
Former Canadian Premier to Prepare Resignation Soon.

OTTAWA, Dec. 7.—(By Canadian Press.)—In spite of the fact that he was at his office until midnight receiving election returns, Premier Meighen arrived there in good time this morning. An atmosphere of quiet pervaded the place following the noise and bustle of last night, when messages announcing the defeat of the government were coming in constantly. Mr. Meighen spent practically the whole morning attending to his correspondence. He received a call from Sir Adam Beck, and at noon went to the office of his excellency the governor-general, where he remained for about half an hour.

The premier had no announcement to make to the press. Asked whether he would wait until the official returns were in before submitting his resignation to the governor-general, he said that it would not be long before they were available. He stated that he would call some meetings of cabinet council shortly in order to clean up matters which required the attention of the present government. The majority of the ministers received the returns in their own constituencies, and it will probably be a day or two before they return to the capital.

98 MAKE TRIP OVER SHRINERS' BURNING SANDS
Include Hon. Peter Smith, Provincial Treasurer, in Their Number.
GIVEN PURSE OF GOLD

A. E. Somerville, Captain-General of Arab Patrol, Is Signally Honored.

With the Shriners from the surrounding district and Detroit, Buffalo, Chicago, and even as far as Indianapolis, attending, the annual fall ceremonial of the Mocha Temple, A. A. O. N. M. S., London, Ont., was held in London Wednesday afternoon.

The guests were received with the heartiest cordiality by the London Shriners, the reception committee being in charge of W. W. Gammage, who, with the members of his committee, and assisted by the Arab Patrol, had provided for their welfare and entertainment.

The ceremonial began with the business session in the morning, starting at 10:30 o'clock, when the business details and affairs for the year were disposed of. At this session the Temple voted \$2,500 to endow a room in the War Memorial Children's Hospital, and \$500 to children's aid organizations and other charities.

One of the pleasant features of the day's proceedings was the presentation of a purse of gold to Captain-General A. E. Somerville of the Arab Patrol. In the afternoon the election of officers for 1922 was held. The following is the divan for the ensuing year: Illustrious potentate, J. F. Reid; chief rabbi, A. Carothers; assistant rabbi, Dr. J. A. Woodhouse; high priest, Jared Vining; oriental guide, A. J. Smith; treasurer, A. A. Campbell; recorder, W. H. Abbott; first ceremonial master, W. C. Forbes; second ceremonial master, T. M. Pawkes; marshal, C. Farquharson; captain of the guard, H. Hayman, and director, W. D. MacGregor.

Ninety-eight candidates crossed the "hot sands," among whom was the Hon. Peter Smith, provincial treasurer for Ontario. The number of Shriners attending was estimated at 1,500. At the morning session the following were appointed representatives to the Imperial Council meeting to be held in San Francisco in June, 1922: J. F. Reid, W. H. Abbott, of London; Dr. J. A. Millard of Windsor, and R. H. Reid of Woodstock.

During the afternoon the Mocha Temple Band, under the leadership of Roscoe Pococke, gave the following program: March, "Old Comrades," by
