DEATH IN GUN ACCIDENT

[Special to The Advertiser.]

Dresden, Jan. 9.—A sad accident occurred here at 3:30 Sunday afternoon as a result of which Dick Hueston, 18 years old, son of Mr. and Mrs. N. Hueston, lost his life. The parents were away and the grandson, Harold Oglethorpe, aged 14, who lived at the Huestons, together with Dick, were examining a gun, the latter giving it to the Oglethorpe boy to put away. The latter throwing it over his shoulder, marched up the steps. Just as he got to the door the gun went off, the bullet piercing the young Hueston in the jaw and penetrating the spinal column.

While the grandson ran for help, the parents returned and found their son lying in a pool of blood. Doctors were called, and he was taken to the hospital about 7:30 p.m., and the bullet located by the X-rays. However, there was little hope held out for his recovery and he succumbed at 1 o'clock this morning.
