

THE ASSESSMENT.—The returns of the southern part of No. 5 Ward have been handed in. The result under all the circumstances must be regarded as very satisfactory, although a reduction will be noted of 16 by the rates. This reduction is principally to be attached to the following causes:-The removal of steel works, which caused a loss of \$14,000 of asssess ment; the reduction made by the Court of Revision last year on the Imperial Oil Works amounting to \$20,000, which has been allowed to stand this year, and the assessment on the Graydon estate has been allowed stand as fixed by the Court of Revision last year, being a considerable reduction on the first assessment, also a large number of vacant lots purchased by the Western Fair have been put the roll, being exempt. The reduction of population is only six in the division south of Dundas street. The decrease in statute labor is to be attributed to the fact that young men were assessed this year at their homes, and much difficulty was experienced in finding them. The number of vacant houses in No. 5 Ward, south of Dundas street, only 59, of which number some, notably those 16 00 or the Park estate, are not fit for habitation.
