

A Big Project.—Canadian Pacific rail-way officials are now discussing a big scheme for improving the grade over the Selkirks at Rogers' pass, and the plan is suggested of constructing a tun-nel through the mountain between flacier and Bear creek. If this is car-ried out, it will be one of the largest engineering constructions on the line, via and will be off great advantage to the company. The tunnel would be three miles in length, and would cost a large sum, as the boring would be nearly all through solid rock.

Pilotage Vacancy.—According to the vancouver papers, it is reported in ship-ping circles that Captain Andrew Bjerre, master of the steamer Active, owned by the B. C. Mills Timber and Trading Ompany, intends to apply for the va-cancy on the Vancouver pilotage ser-vice caused by the death of Captain E. C. Bridgman, and the probabilities are that he will get the position. Cap-tain Bjerre has had considerable ex-perience in deep water navigation, and before his appointment to the Active was in command of the sealing schooner Betrice, and also of the steamer Queen Gity. Imported Fruit.—The rigid inspection of fruit from the states of Oregon, Washington and California has proulted in much cleaner shipments being made. The condemnations this year, because of the presence principally of codin moth and San Jose scale, have been very large, and since the middle of August a marked improvement in the quality of fruit has been soliced. The credit of this is due to the fujihnee of the inspector's office.
