ENGLAND'S OLDEST BANK TO DISAPPEAR

Child and Company Private Institution to be Absorbed by Glyn Mills and Company—Has Had Notable Career.

London, May 3.—Child and Company, the oldest private bank in England, and perhaps in the world, is to be absorbed by Glyn Mills and Company, in accordance with the will of the Eighth Earl of Jersey senior partner who died on December 31.
Child's Bank was founded about the year 1660, has occupied the site of its present offices in Fleet Street ever since, and is full of historic associations. Oliver Cromwell, Samuel Pepys, Horace Walpole, the poet Dryden, Charles II. and his famous paramour, Nell Gwynn, were the many prominent persons who had access to the bank, which is identical with "Tollson's" in Dickens's Tale of Two Cities.
The latest balance sheet of Child and Company showed deposits of £3,000,000. Combined with Glyn's they will exceed £60,000,000.
