The Toronto Tobogganing Club. Few people are perhaps aware of the existence in this city of a flourishing tobogganing club, with a membership of about 150 persons. The organization is known as the Toronto tobogganing club. The slide is situated on Mather's farm, now the property of the Scottish and Ontario land company, in Rosedale, and it compares favorably with Montreal's best slides. It has an incline of 400 feet, with a run of a quarter of a mile. The slide is constructed of natural material only, and is very pretty to look at. This is the first year of the club's existence, and a prospectus is being issued to look at. The slide was opened about Dec. 17 last, since which time it has been in excellent condition. Saturday afternoon the greatest field days, and the members of the club turn out in full force. The slide is lit up several nights during the week also. To-night a large gathering is anticipated. Mr. Henry O'Brien is president and A. H. Campbell is secretary. The Toronto tobogganing club promises to rival the most famous of Montreal, Quebec or Ottawa clubs in the immediate future. There is also a half mile tobogganing slide at Lambton Mills which is said to be unexcelled in Canada. A party of Toronto ladies and gentlemen go out three times a week and slide from 5 to 9 o'clock after which the party partake of refreshments at a village hotel.
