The Iroquois call a Wife, *Sannatella*: the Persians, 76. *San* and *Sen*: the Curdi, 77, *Senne*. The Indians of Pennsylvania call Bread, *Pane*‡: Indians of New-England, *Paune***: the Delawares, Ach-paan: the Onendagos, *Iochbarácbqua*: the Cheerake, Kawtoo; the Woccrons *Ikettaw*. The Curdi, 77, *Pan*. The Eskimaux call the Eye, *Killick* or *Shik*: the inhabitants of the Kurile-Isles, 162, *Schoek*, or *Seek*. The former call an Egg, *Manneguk*: the Tchiuchonki, 54, *Moona*: the Estlandians, 55, *Moonna*: the Vogoulitchi, 69, *Moongee*: the Semoyads, 123, *Maina*: 124, *Monna*: 125, *Monoo*; the Kamastshini, 132, *Moonee*. The Eskimaux call the numeral three, *Ke*: the Semoyads, 120, *Koe*: 121, *Ko*. The Algonkins call a
