**VICTORIA (B.C.) DOG AND POULTRY SHOW.**

The first exhibition of the Victoria Dog and Poultry Association was declared open to the public by His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor and Mrs. Nelson; among the visitors present being Mr. D. M. Eberts, president; and Lieut.-Col. Prior, M. P., treasurer of the society; Chief Justice Sir Matthew B. Begbie, Hon. Judge O'Rielly, Mr. F. S. Barnard, M. P., and a large number of ladies and gentlemen of social prominence.

The delicious music of "C" Battery band was mingled with the occasional howling of the homesick canines and the cackling of the fowls, as the visitors inspected the exhibits and commented on their individual excellencies.

Passing down the right, on entering, a number of splendented Setters, of all the

peculiar breeds, are first visited. Then come Grey-hounds, Deer-hounds, Retrievers and all the other intelligent friends of the sportsmen; with several sturdy Mastiffs occupying a prominent position at the View street end of the rink. Spaniels and pet dogs of many kinds are found in full force; while "toy" dogs, no bigger than kittens are not fifty feet away from the family of Great Danes, Danish boar hounds, massive creatures, with faultless symmetrical limbs, and almost speaking eyes. These handsome animals are the property of Mr. Meyer of Port Townsend, and are apparently the visitors' favorites. In all, over 150 dogs are exhibited and each and all are splendid specimens of the canine race.
