An enthusiastic meeting of the Cathedral Committee was held on Fridat last, when it was resolved to go on with the building with such sum of money as may be in hand by Aug. 12th, when the corner stone will be lul About \$20,000 are already subscribed. It was determined also to appose an organizing secretary on salary, to thoroughly canvast and arouse the sentiment of the diocese in this matter. A representative sub-committee from the city was named, to have charge of all arrangements in connection with the celebration of Aug. 12th, and sermous are to be preached throughout the diocese for the Cathedral fund on Sunday, June 19th. Thus the parishes will have an opportunity of combining their loyalty to both charge and state.

The provisions by which the denomination in the Lower Provinces were represented on the Board of Trustees no longer exist, as the representation on the Board of Governors, which will replace the Board of Trustees, is confined to the Baptists of Ontario and Quebec.

The lieptists of the Southern States have lately hold their annual convention at Louisville, Ky. From the reports presented, we learn that there was contributed to foreign missions last year \$87,830, and that there are 116 foreign missions supported by the board. Connected with the home mission work there are 251 ministers, 822 churches and stations, 318 Sunday schools, and 31,031 teachers and scholars.

At a meeting of the Presbytery of Halifax, held at Noel on Tuesday last, the Rev J. C. Cattanack tendered his resignation of the pastorate of St. Andrew's Church of this city.
