

SHIPPING NEWS.

REPORTS, &c.

Steamer *Eturia*, which arrived at Queens town on Saturday from New York, is reported by the New York agents to have made the following daily run: 400, 432, 433, 450, 414, 424 and 362 miles.

Barque *M. & E. Cann* has been chartered to load at Miramichi for Liverpool 300 tons birch timber, 500 tons pine timber, 20, deals 51 & 3d.

Barque *Laura Emily* (of Maitland, NS), Campbell, at New York from Santander May 6, had a heavy WSW gale, lost and split sails; 24th, lat 42 34, lon 45 21, had a hard gale from NW to N, split sails and lost top-sailant yard, 27th, lat 48 01, lon 49 02, passed ten icebergs.

Barque *Guiana*, from New York for Yokohama (before reported), was towed to Sourabaya April 20 from Ambona, where she put in with 7 feet water in hold. The vessel will go into dry dock.

Brig *Columbian*, Mustard master, was at Bahia on the 11th May, chartered for Montreal, Halifax and United States, at 22s 6d sterling per ton for Halifax or United States, or 27s 6d if ordered to Montreal. Her cargo will be sugar in bags.

Schr *Avonia*, which went ashore on the south beach of Long Island in January last, was bought by parties in Poughkeepsie, LI, and hauled off and repaired. Has had an American register given her and has been named *Gusie Blith*.

Schr *Clifton*, Capt Parsons, which arrived at Windsor on Monday from New York, made the round trip from Westworth Creek to New York and back in 16 days.

A telegram from New York reports the schr *Barbara F. Latimer* ashore and bilged at River India, near Aspinwall.

Capt Phillips, of ship *Ecuador*, of Yarmouth (now in New York), has had a mild form of small pox and been in the hospital at that city. He is now recovering, and able to walk about. The ship sailed yesterday in charge of Capt Charles Grant.

The cargo of barque *Underwriter*, at Bermuda from New York for Bilbao, is advertised by the receiver, general to be sold at auction 10th inst for breach of the revenue act.

LONDON June 11—The crew of ship *Cyprus*, which was abandoned at sea April 17, while on a voyage from Calcutta for New York, have been landed at Falmouth.

LONDON June 12—Barque *Harold*, Power, from New York, while in tow collided with the steamer *Aquitaine*. The barque carried away her bowsprit and the steamer had some of her plates stove.

WINDSOR June 12—A collision occurred off Horton Bluff on Wednesday evening, between the schr *G. A. Good* and another smaller vessel; the damage is estimated at from \$75 to \$100.

The *Liverpool Journal of Commerce* says: "We understand that Capt Dunham, of the ship *Alexander Yeats*, 1554 tons, hailing from the port of St John, NB, has discharged his cargo of wheat from San Francisco in such splendid order that the owners of the cargo, to show their appreciation of the ship and the captain's extreme care, have presented him with a handsome gold watch, bearing the following inscription: Presented to Captain James Dunham, ship *Alexander Yeats*, by W. Marshall & Sons, Grimsby, for valuable services, April 21st, 1885." The *Alexander Yeats* is owned by Messrs Alexander Yeats & Sons, St John, NB, and is well and favorably known in the Eastern and San Francisco trades.

On the first day of July next the light on Entry Island, Magdalen Islands, in the Gulf of St Lawrence, will be changed from a fixed red light, as it has been heretofore, to a fixed white or bright light, and will be continued as a fixed white light thereafter.
