Last year, after they drove away Mr. Mc-Kenzie's teacher, some young men deter-mined to take the gospel, so they moved to the small isle where the marryr's body was left and began a new village. Two teachers joined them, shortly one and another came! over to them, until, when I was there in July, the new village was the largest, with a fine grass house in the centre for the teachers, and a neat grass church enclosed at one end.
