THE NURSERY AND MAIDEN.

The cup presented by Lieut. Col. Maunsell, D. A. G., and \$142 added by the P. R. A. Cup open only to efficient members of the active militia of New Brunswick who have never won a first prize at any provincial competition. Money prize open only to such efficient members of the active militia of New Brunswick as have not won a money prize larger than one of \$4 at any previous Provincial or Dominion competition. The maiden team prizes shall be open to teams of the three previously named officers, non-commissioned officers or men from any corps in the province, who have not attended a previous competition of the Provincial Rifle Association. Ranges 400 and 500 yards ; five shots at each range ; position, any, with head to target.
