CANBERRA (CP) - External Affairs Minister Joe Clark said today the South African Government turns its ambassadors into "stunt men" whenever the Commonwealth meets to discuss apartheid.

CLARKS IN THE RUSTRALIAN CAPITAL CANBERRA FOR THE FOURTH MEETING OF THE COMMONHEALTH COMMITTEE OF FOREIGN MINISTERS ON SOUTHERN REFRICAS HAS RESPONDING TO A POLL RELEASED IN OTTAHA ON TUESDAY BY THE SOUTH REFRICAN EMBASSY INDICATING CANADIANS OPPOSE SANCTIONS IF THEY HURT THE BLACK MAJORITY.

""HELLS IT'S A CURIOUS FACT THAT HHILE SOUTH AFRICA TRIES TO DISCOUNT THE IMPORTANCE OF THE COMMONHEALTHS EVERY TIME HE HOLD A MEETING THEY TURN THEIR ANDRESSADORS INTO STUNT MENS'S CLARK SAID HHILE ENTERING A COMMITTEE ROOM TO START THE THIRD AND FINAL DAY OF THE CONFERENCE.

THE POLL SAID WHEN THOSE QUESTIONED HERE ASKED IF THEY HOULD SUPPORT SAUCTIONS OR TRADE RESTRICTIONS "IF THEY RESULTED IN HARDSHIP FOR BLBCK SOUTH AFRICANS; 22 ONLY 37 PER CENT OF THOSE SURVEYED SAID YES. FIFTY-THO PER CENT HERE OPPOSED.

CLARK SAID INCREASED SOUTH AFRICAN ACTIVITY SURROUNDING THE COMMONHEALTH MEETINGS INDICATES THEY ARE HAVING AN EFFECT ON THE PRETORIA GOVERNMENT.

## DRAFTS REPLY

CLARK ALSO SAID HE DRAFTED A REPLY TO A LETTER FROM FOREIGN MINISTER PIK BOTHA OF SOUTH AFRICA URGING COMMONHEALTH FOREIGN MINISTERS TO REJECT A REPORT WHICH SAID SANCTIONS AGAINST SOUTH AFRICA ARE EFFECTIVE AND IN SOME CASES HELPED CREATE JOBS FOR BLACKS.

CLARK SAID SINCE THE LETTER HAS HRITTEN TO HIM IN HIS CAPACITY AS CHAIRHAN OF THE CONFERENCE: HE HANTED TO SEEK THE APPROVAL OF THE OTHER HIMISTERS AT TODAY'S MEETING BEFORE RELEASING ITS CONTENTS.

On Tuesday, the ministers agreed to ask banks to put pressure on South Africa by imposing tough repayment terms on the billions of Dollars the country ones them.

THE MINISTERS SAID BANKS SHOULD EXERT AS MUCH PRESSURE AS POSSIBLE MITHOUT MAKING SOUTH AFRICA DEFAULT ON ITS LOAMS. THE PROPOSALS HERE MADE IN LIGHT OF SOUTH AFRICA'S NEED TO RESCHEDULE ITS FOREIGN DEBT BY JUNE 1990.

THE COMMONHEALTH COMMITTEE OF FOREIGN MINISTERS ON SOUTHERN AFRICA DISCUSSED THE POSSIBLE MERSURES AS PART OF AN ATTEMPT TO FORCE PRETORIA TO END APARTHEID.

EXTERNAL REFAIRS MINISTER JOE CLARKS CHAIRMAN OF THE MEETINGS SAID THE COMMONHEALTH WILL PROPOSE MEETINGS WITH SENIOR OFFICIALS OF THE BANKS INVOLVED IN RESCHEDULING THE DEBT.
