PRAYERS.

Mr. Fournier (Hull), a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of June 30, 1952, for a copy of the pay-rolls and a statement of the materials purchased in connection with the construction and repair of the protection wall at Lac Megantic, county of Compton-Frontenac, since 1941.

The House resolved itself again into Committee of Supply, and progress having been made and reported, the Committee obtained leave to sit again later this day.

By unanimous consent, the House reverted to "Motions" under "Routine Proceedings".

By leave of the House, on motion of Mr. Fournier (Hull), it was then resolved:—That, notwithstanding the terms of any Special or Standing Order, the House remain in continuous session this day until otherwise ordered.
