Mr. SPENCER:

What quantity of wheat, if any, originating in the United States was taken into public or private terminal elevators in Canada in each of the years of 1921, 1922 and 1923?

Hon. Mr. LOW:

No wheat of United States origin is handled in the public and private terminal elevators in the Western Inspection Division. A small amount of United States corn sometimes is received at the head of the lakes. The public elevators in the eastern inspection division, however, regularly receive considerable quantities of United States wheat in transit. The amounts handled during the crop years ended August 31st, 1921, 22 and 23 were as follows:
