Question No. 2,244—Mr. Cossitt:

1. Does CBC require as a matter of policy a stereotyped style on the part of their newscasters?
2. Does CBC stipulate the use of the news style used by former CBOT anchorman Ab Douglas in preference to the style used by Max Keeping of CTV's Ottawa outlet?

TRIDENT AIRCRAFT LIMITED

Question No. 2,427—Mr. Munro (Esquimalt-Saanich):

1. (a) During the fiscal years 1979-80 and 1980-81, what amount of public funds was advanced to the Trident Aircraft Co. of Sidney, British Columbia and for what purpose (b) what amount is to be advanced during the fiscal year 1981-82 and for what purpose?
2. (a) Is Mr. Derek Lock still attached to the Trident Aircraft Co. (b) did he re-enter the Public Service and, if so, in what capacity and in which department?
3. Does the government have any commitments to the Trident Aircraft Co. and, if so, what are they?

Mr. D. M. Collenette (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Privy Council):

I am informed by the Departments of Industry, Trade and Commerce and Regional Economic Expansion as follows:

1. (a) Public funds in the form of a repayable contribution were advanced by IT&C to Trident Aircraft Limited as follows:

Fiscal year 1979/80	\$1,300,000.
Fiscal year 1980/81	\$2,700,000.

The repayable contribution was to assist in the re-structuring of the company to enable the completion and production start-up of the Trigull amphibian aircraft.

- (b) IT&C has not planned to advance any funds to Trident Aircraft Limited for 1981/82.
2. (a) Mr. Derek Lock is no longer with Trident Aircraft Limited and has left the Public Service.
- (b) Not applicable.

3. Under the Canada-British Columbia Industrial Development Subsidiary Agreement, DREE has agreed to cost share with the province a low interest loan in the amount of \$2.9 million to the British Columbia Development Corporation (BCDC) to finance the construction of 110,000 square feet of manufacturing space for Trident Aircraft Ltd. at the Victoria International Airport. This loan to BCDC, which will build the space for Trident on a lease-back basis, has as one of its conditions, the requirement that Trident must have all its financing in place before any disbursement will be made on the loan. As this condition has not been met, no DREE funds have been disbursed to date under the terms of the agreement with BCDC for the Trident facility, and in view of the cessation of Trident, it is not anticipated that any money will be disbursed in the future.
