

CONFEDERATION ESSAYS.

The National Committee for the Celebration of the Diamond Jubilee of Confederation has presented to McGill University three medals, in gold, silver and bronze, to be awarded as prizes for essays on Confederation. Those eligible to compete are undergraduates, graduates or 1927 and graduates who have been in attendance at the University proceeding to post-graduate degrees during the present session.

Essays must be addressed to the Registrar and must be received on or before September 15th. The award will be announced at the Fall Convocation.

Essays may deal with the facts of Confederation or with any phase of Canadian history or political development, past or future, as affected by Confederation or bearing upon the relations between the Provinces and the Central Government. The Committee has set no restriction upon the length of the essays but considers five or six thousand words should be adequate. Essays may be in English or French.
