BUSINESS FAILURES.

Commercial failures last week in the United States, as reported by R. G. Dun & Co., were 17, against 17 the previous week, and 287 the corresponding week last year, failures in Canada number 15, against 12 the previous week and 27 last year.

LIVE STOCK MARKET

With a run of about 5700 head of cattle on the Union Stock Yards exchange yesterday, at \$11.00 per head, considerably lower, the decline ranging all the way from \$1.00 per head, the latter being the cause in exceptional cases.
