

## TORONTO'S EXAMPLE FIRES AMERICANS

Over \$27,000,000 Subscribed  
From Other Side  
of Border.

Yesterday's story of the Victory Loan furnishes food for thought in one outstanding particular. It is the fact that the things being done by our cousins across the line in the way of investment in Canada's loan. A list is given of nearly forty firms that have bought, some in exceptionally large amounts, and if anything were needed to make for the people of Canada assurance doubly sure it would be the whole-hearted confidence in the Canadian loan which the investments of these firms affords.

Americans have a keen appreciation of Victory bonds. Subscriptions from the other side up to last night totaled \$27,281,550, two millions more than was collected last year in the entire campaign. It is a collection, not a canvass.

According to J. H. Gundy, who has this collection in hand: "Our collection in the United States has been concerned itself with Canadian residents there and with American companies whose business reaches into Canada. Interested as they are in the well-being and progress of this country, it is only right that they should be extended the opportunity of contributing.

"The American field is divided into four sections—New York, Boston, central and Chicago. Four or five bondmen are responsible for each section. Some of them wear the little bronze button, and when the Americans recognize its 'service shine from' significance they become voluble in expressing their respect for the high fighting qualities of Canadians. American knowledge of trade and business figures is growing at a surprising rate. They see much material for deep thought in the fact that during the past twelve months the total foreign trade of their great country was only five times as large as ours. They realize now what a lively lusty nation they have for a neighbor.

"Canadian bonds meet with a high measure of appreciation in the United States. There is little doubt that the amount we count upon from the United States' subscriptions, \$55,000,000, will be secured by the end of next week. This total may be exceeded. What has been collected to date, following the wishes of subscribers, has been allocated to various districts in Canada and absorbed into Victory Loan totals."

Among American subscriptions are the following, not previously reported:

**Near Three Millions.**  
Nearly three millions was the amount of sales made by the headquarters teams in the five Toronto districts yesterday. This was encouraging, but there is much ground to be covered and many subscribers to be "signed up" before the present total of something over forty-eight and a half million reaches the ninety-million objective set for the "Queen City. Doubtless many are holding back to share in the glorious raising a surprise in the total of the last week, but it will help wonderfully if prospective investors act now, instead of piling up work for canvassers during the last few days of the loan.

The educational institutions are doing well, the canvassers whose duties it is to cover the university and other seats of learning reporting a most sympathetic reception.

At the schools devoted exclusively to girls, Branksome Hall, Moulton College and St. Margaret's, the response has been so generous that it is confidently expected that they will soon qualify for the honor flags.

The teaching staff at Dufferin School has already reached the 100 per cent. efficiency total.

The smaller industries are falling into line rapidly. Last night Business Systems Limited, on Spadina avenue, reported that 700 per cent. of their employees had subscribed to the loan, and that 25 per cent. of their annual payroll, the total amount being \$4,500.

Welch & McLaren Limited came on with 22 out of 28 employees subscribing, equaling 17 per cent. of the payroll. One hundred and thirty-eight employees of J. Schrader & Sons, Limited, purchased bonds amounting to \$14,100 and 15 per cent. of the annual payroll. At W. R. Perrin, Limited, East King street, 91 per cent. of the employees invested in bonds.

Division B boasts of the champion salesman in D. Sinclair, who has covered the field in the number of applications turned in, 473, and also in the amount of money secured, \$1,000,000. Capt. S. Vinen's team, B. Sorey of the same division is also well up in the race.

**Not All Milk.**  
The life of a canvasser is not all milk and honey. Lieut. Gordon Mc-

Laren, while "patrolling" his district in Parkdale the other day, encountered what he described in telling the story, a "Hunt" of the worst kind. When asked to buy a bond the individual opened up a tirade of abuse upon the loan, which was couched in anti-Bolshevik strain, with the statement that he would not buy a bond until the "red flag floated at Ottawa."

To make his attitude more emphatic he launched an attack at the crippled canvasser who made an effective counter-charge. There were cries of "Kamerad," also howls for the police, but these soon ceased when the canvasser in his turn threatened to lay a charge of uttering seditious language against his assailant. The end is not yet, according to McLaren, who says that he will sell the Parkdale Socialist a "bond or bust."

**At Red Triangle.**  
At the Red Triangle last night Mayor Church congratulated the twenty-one members of the staff on their splendid work in the loan. They had subscribed 50 per cent. of their payroll and had paid 70 per cent. of their investment in cash. One purchaser subscribing to the amount of \$1750. J. M. Godfrey presented the well-won honors.

Another centre of interest last night was the district of Allen Theatre Park, where bands, vaudeville, the tanks and a tremendous Guy Fawkes celebration drew the crowd. Ex-controller McCarthy made an appeal for the loan, speaking from the tanks in which he offered the lure of a ride to the first purchaser of a \$50 bond. Harry McKee made an appeal for 20 Eastmount avenue, was the first to lead the way, his purchase being made from money given him weekly by his mother for services rendered. Harry's example was contagious and the tanks had many tenants later.
