

FRIDAY MORNING Trying to Match Marathon Men Tom Longboat v. Alfred Shrubbs

Indian Resolves to Remain Amateur Until After Olympic Games —Irish-Canadian Club's Meet.

Someone in Boston is trying to make a match between Shrubbs and Longboat. Last night the Indian was interviewed and referred everyone to Tom Flanagan, who says there is no likelihood of the contest, at least until after the Marathon in England next year. Mr. Flanagan says Longboat will run in the Irish-Canadian meet next week at a distance of 10 miles. He is a member of the six Nations Athletic Club. The organization has asked Mr. Flanagan to look after the Indian, and has been expelled from the West End Y.M.C.A. Longboat will have no official connection with any club for a year. Shrubbs will be here as a spectator next week.

From the looks of things at this distance, the Irish-Canadian Club's big meet on July 20 will be decorated by the finest collection of champions ever pulled together in Canada, if not indeed on the continent.

The list so far includes five great American and world's champions from the Irish-Canadian Athletic Club, New York: George V. Boning, the world's champion walker; John Flanagan, the world's champion weight-thrower; M. J. Sheridan, world's all-around champion; J. J. Daley, the distance champion, and the University of Pennsylvania's great colored running wonder, John B. Taylor.
