

CHICAGO GOSSIP.

Henry A. King & Co., 12 King-street east, received the following despatch to-day from Chicago:

Wheat opened about ½ cent firmer this morning at 81%c for May, and the opening was within ½c of high point for the day. The bulk of the news all day was bullish, but it had no effect on prices, as there was not enough trade; it was from opening to close a very quiet day, and quite a perceptible lack of outside business. Northwest receipts were 313 cars, against 361 a year ago. The visible supply decreased more than expected, 1,413,000 bushels, wheat on passage decreased 720,000 bushels, and the English visible increased 370,000 bushels. Early cables were a farthing higher, and later cables unchanged. There is no special feature to the market to-day, and the only looked-for influence to-morrow will be Bradstreet's statement, which is expected to show a liberal decrease. On any further reactions the markets should be a purchase.

Corn and oats were steady to firm early, but weakened later, with free selling on the part of those who have been buyers, and in sympathy with the wheat market. Receipts were 331 cars corn and 272 cars of oats. Both markets closed weak.

Provisions—There was very light trading in provisions, and the market's range was narrow. Transactions were chiefly confined to May contracts. Offerings were light. Hog receipts were liberal, 52,000, with 37,000 estimated for to-morrow.

The speculative situation continues to discourage fresh operations on the long side, and as the soutiment of the most influential traders rather inclines to the bear side we cannot hope for healthy markets until Europe demonstrates her wants in a more positive manner than by sending out statistics of future requirements.
