

SEPTRE WON THE OAKS

King Edward and the Prince of Wales
Were at Epsom Downs in
the Rain.

OUTSIDERS WIN AT HAMILTON

Summaries at Gravesend, Harlem,
Latonia and St. Louis and

London, June 6.—Ladies' Day at Epsom
was marred to-day by rain. King Edward,
the Prince of Wales and other members of
the Royal family started for the course in
