LOCAL CONTRACTORS LOSE.

The injunction restraining the city from granting contracts for asphalt pavements on Spadina and Fern-avenues, amounting to \$70,000, to the Forest City Paving Co., was dismissed by Mr. Justice Lount at Osgoode Hall yesterday.

G. F. Shepley, K.C., for the plaintiffs, argued that the quality of the asphalt used by the defendants was not up to specifications. He quoted a number of expert opinions in support of his argument. S. S. Lobb, for the city, pointed out that the specifications required that the asphalt should be equal to Aichatras asphalt, which is used in Brooklyn. This, he contended, bound the contractors tighter. His Lordship seemed to think that this was an alternative clause and that the specification requiring to be equal to the asphalt of Aichatras was sufficient.

Judge Lount, in giving judgment, said: "There is no doubt as to the condition of the roads. They are unsafe and dangerous. If an injunction were granted now it would in all probability prevent reconstruction this year as the trial of this case would not be held till September, and appeals would cause further delay. So I would have to be well satisfied before I could continue the injunction that the plaintiffs have made out a case. I think their contentions fail. The procedure of the Board of Control and Council seem to me to be regular. All that was asked of the contractors was to state the kind of asphalt they proposed to use. The Forest City Co. did this. Their tender was accepted. The specifications say the quality of the asphalt must be equal to the best quality of Trinidad, Bermudez, or German Rock. It seems to me the whole point in the case is when it is to be determined. It is not to be supposed that the city was to know the different kinds of asphalt. The Engineer is the sole judge, and I think it was for him to make the test in when the asphalt is produced—when the pavements are being laid."
