The Cherokees attract little attention at present; they are not permitted by law to sell any land until five years after the allotment. The Chocktaws and Chickasaws are a little more interesting; they can sell one-eighth of their allotment one year after receiving a patent, another eighth in three years, and the remaining quarter in five years. The remaining half they must retain as a homestead for twenty-one years during the life of the allottee.

Indians Were Tricked, It's Claimed, The full blood Indians live on terms of friendship and social equality with the negroes, but they are naturally chagrined at the consequences of adopting their former slaves as members of their tribes. They cherish a tradition to the effect that it was all bers of thei rtribes. Tarvin, a dentist, practicing here. In his personal appearance Dr. Tarvin would pass for a southern colonel, and his speech is softly reminiscent of his old home in Georgia.
