CHILDREN JEER BISHOP AND HE JOKES ABOUT IT

But His Lordship Uses Incident to Point Moral of Contrast Between Canada and England.

HAMILTON, Oct. 7.—(Special).—As he was leaving the synod meeting at Christ Church Cathedral this afternoon, Bishop Dumoulin was surrounded by a crowd of street urchins, who jeered his knickers and gaiters. The bishop referred to the incident at a reception held this evening at the close of the synod, and laughingly remarked that he would have boxed their ears had he not been a bishop. He mentioned the subject in connection with a report he made on his visit to the Pan-Anglican conference, and remarked that the children of England did not seem to be as irreverent as the children of Canada.

POLITICAL NOTES.

CITY PEOPLE WHO VOTE IN SOUTH YORK.

The riding of South York is made up of the Township of York, less the Village of Weston and less the City of Toronto as it was in 1903, when the adjustment of the constituencies took place. Since that time, however, certain portions of the township along the then bounds of the city have been added to the city, notably the portion on Avenue-road on the hill and above the hill, known as the Avenue-road annex, and certain portions of North York, known as the Rosedale annex. The houses in these sections continue to be in South York and will necessarily have to vote in South York at the forthcoming election. There is no "putting them out of the city into the county," as some of the newspapers say; but they simply remain where they were in South York at the time of the readjustment. Those people in the Avenue-road annex who were added to the city since 1903, and those in Rosedale who were added to the city since that date, are in South York today. They have changed their municipality, but they have not changed their parliamentary division.

Sixth Ward Conservatives will meet in the hall at Queen-street and North-cote-avenue to-night. E. B. Osler and Claude Macdonell will speak.
