Business houses destroyed are: Wilson Printing Co.; Argue's gents' furnishings store; Lomis' candy store; Flerher's tobacco store and poolroom; Bateman's clothing store; Fulton's butcher shop; White's barber shop.

Argue's store was located in the handsome Sandie block, which narrowly escaped destruction. The Imperial Bank, Masonic hall and opera house are badly damaged by smoke and water.
