Rev. Dr. Pethick's First Sermon in James Street Baptist Church— Events of Two Days.

HAMILTON, April 17.—(Special.)—“Keep your hand on your pocketbook when the man who is always talking religion and carries a Bible under his arm all the time comes around,” was the advice given by Rev. Dr. Pethick, formerly of Brooklyn, N.Y., in the course of his sermon here to-night. The doctor preached his first sermon in James-street Baptist Church to-day. The foregoing remarks occurred in the sermon the pastor preached on “The Brother of the Prodigal Son.” The preacher warned his congregation about becoming too rigid, and asked of them all to welcome the prodigal. 

Object Lesson By French Suffragist. Candidate for Chamber of Deputies Displays Male Idiot on Platform to Prove Her Arguments.

PARIS, April 17.—Mme. Marguerite Durand, a candidate for the chamber of deputies from one of the Paris districts, has conceived the novel electioneering scheme.

Last night she announced widely that she would appear in joint debate with Charles Marec, a candidate for the majority at the crowded meeting when Mrs. Durand ascended to the platform, accompanied by a man, whom she introduced as Marec. It was immediately apparent that the man was a hopeless idiot, Mme. Durand had had his name registered as a candidate.

The brainy woman began her speech, while the man, poor imbecile, grinned and chattered.

“Marec is an interesting medical case,” said Mme. Durand, calmly. “There is no harm in bringing him here, for he does not understand what is going on and he neither enjoys being conspicuous.”

“I wish only to give you an object lesson. The law allows this idiot to vote and to be a candidate for the chamber of deputies. By his side stands a woman in the full exercise of her intelligence and yet she is denied the privileges he has by law.”

The Washington Convention. WASHINGTON, D.C., April 17.—(Special.)—A copy of the report of Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, in which she, by inference, took exception to the attitude of President Taft on the question of suffrage, was delivered at the White House Saturday.

The delivery of the speech to the president followed out the instructions of the convention, which voted unanimously to send the speech to every politician in the country, from the chief executive down.

Mrs. Catt, in reply to the statement of the president that the “least desirable” would exercise the suffrage if the enfranchisement of the colored people and the immigrants, disclosing that when they were enfranchised, there was no fear that only the “least desirable” element would exercise this right to the ballot. She also declared for militant methods in working for the suffrage.

The suffragists have taken to outdoor meetings here to explain their position in the presidential matter. Miss Ray Costello of England, and Alice Paul, the Philadelphia girl, who was imprisoned for conducting the suffrage riots in England, were among the outdoor speakers.
