ORIENTAL AND OCCIDENTAL STARS.

Venus will be a Morning Star from the commencement of the year till April, and too near the Sun, during the remainder of the year, to be in a favourable situation for viewing her.

Mars will be a Morning Star from the middle of July to the end of the year. In the former part of the year he will be near the Sun, and

very seldom visible.

Jupiter will be a Morning Star till the middle of March; then an Evening and Morning Star till May; an Evening Star till August; he will then be too near the Sun till the end of the year.

Saturn will be visible in the morning til! April; then seen as an Evening and Morning Star till June; then he will be visible during the evening till November, when he approaches the Sun.
