JOURNAL OF SYNOD.

WEDNESDAY, JULY 5TH, 1876.

THE Synod of the Diocese of Fredericton met on this ay in the School-room adjoining St. John's Church in the ity of St. John, at half-past 9 o'clock, A. M.

The Lord Bishop of the Diocese in the Chair.

The Lord Bishop called the attention of the Synod to e peculiar position in which the Synod found itself placed. the time of the adjournment of the Synod of 1875, the ecretary, Rev. John Pearson, about to leave the Diocese, d not officially resigned. Thus the Synod was unable elect his successor. Under these circumstances, and stead of calling a special meeting of the Synod to elect a cretary, his Lordship took upon himself to request the ergy that the certificates of the Lay Delegates for the nod of this year be sent to himself. According to the istitution of the Synod, the Secretary should certify that Delegates were duly elected. But there being no Secary, the Bishop had taken this course, and now had the tificates of all the Parishes, and presented them to the nod. With permission of the Synod, his Lordship would w declare the Delegates, whose certificates of election he d in his hand, duly elected.

His Lordship then read the list of Parishes and Cures, h the names of the Lay Delegates.
