I have the honor to acknowledge
the receipt of your letter dated
the 12 Inst. No. 99258, relative to the
public, making use of a certain
street in the Huron Village of Lorette
and in reply, I beg to state that the
street in question has been in existence
ever since the Huron Tribe came
to reside on Lorette in 1697.

I have consulted the oldest
members of the tribe concerning
this matter but could not obtain
any other information, I am con-
-sequently unable to give any further
details.

^{regard} With ~~to~~ the circumstances under
which this street was first opened,
I must say that formerly it was
customary for the Indians to settle
near a river and this is what
these Indians did -

The street in question is the first one
east and nearest to ^{the} river St. Charles
and the street was traced out
owing to the houses being
built
