**WALES MAY VISIT CANADA** MALES MAY VISIT CANADA

Montreal, April 16.—A special London cable says: It is rumored that the Prince and Princess of Wales will pay another visit to Canada in the near future. The last visit of the Prince and Princess of Wales to Canada (they were then the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York) was in 1901, when they made the grand tour of all the colonies. They left Portsmouth in the steamship Ophir on March 16 of that year and proceeded to Australia, where the prince opened the first parliament of the commonwealth of Australia. After visiting New Zealand they proceeded to South Africa and thence to Canada, landing at Quebec. They crossed the continent and eventually sailed from Halifax for England, where they arrived in November.



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
