Stirring Speeches at Launch of New War Loan

London, Jan. 11.—"They had forgotten what we were like in the old days, but it will take them a long time again to forget this lesson." "The Allied peoples are looking to Great Britain, trusting her rugged strength, her great resources. She is, to them, like a tower in the deep."

"I want to see your cheeks hurting through the air to the enemy entrenchments. Every well directed check, properly loaded and timed, is a more formidable weapon of destruction than a twelve-inch shell."

These are a few of the striking sentences employed by Premier Lloyd George in his Guildhall speech today appealing for subscriptions to the new war loan. The speech made a deep impression, and is regarded as effective answer to the German peace campaign as is the joint Allied note published in the morning papers here today with comments of warm approval.

Bonar Law announced that the basis for the new war loan was an issue at five per cent. and the price 95. The period of the loan was thirty years, with an option for redemption in twelve years. The chancellor said five per cent. would be paid on application and the balance in equal proportions. The last payment would be on May 30. The government, the chancellor added, was giving an option of a tax free loan at the rate of four per cent. issued at par, to be redeemable at the option of the state at the end of twelve years.

Foreign holders of the stock, he announced, would not be liable to the income tax. A sinking fund will be established in connection with the loan, the chancellor announced. Each month one-eighth of one per cent. of the total sum will be set aside until a total of \$10,000,000 is accumulated, which will be used in purchasing the stock whenever it falls below the issue price, thus giving stability to the loan.

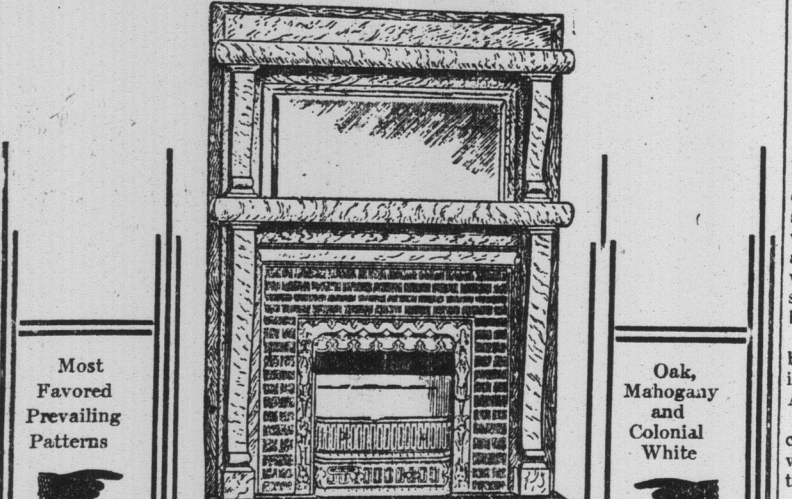

INVITED CANADIAN SKATERS TO NORWAY

Wanted Team to Participate in International Championships—Fame of Canadian Skaters Spreading

Montreal, Jan. 10.—An informal meeting of the officers of the Amateur Skating Association of Canada decided to decline with thanks a request received from Norway to send two skaters, and the hon. secretary of the Association to take part in the International Championships there.

The meeting was presided over by President James Taylor. So anxious were the Norway people that the Canadians should go that although they themselves preferred February 17 and 18 they were willing to let the Canadian skating authorities suggest other dates upon which to hold the championships if necessary, barring, however, the last weeks in both January and February.

The letter was signed by Charles Suhr, Honorary President of the Norwegian Skating Association, and addressed to Ald. Louis Rubenstein.

The state of war which exists, and its consequent sporting conditions, make it virtually impossible to accept the invitation.
