## STORM KILLS 12 IN SUBURB OF BERLIN

Cloudburst Causes Bowling Alley to Cave in, Burying 60 Excursionists

BERLIN, July 4.—Twelve persons were killed and many injured in a violent thunder storm which swept over the Berlin suburb of Woltersdorf.

Thousands of excursionists were surprised and almost overwhelmed by the sudden cloudburst; hundreds of them took refuge in a covered bowling alley. Values of water pouring down from the hills undermined the walls of the alley, which caved in, burying 60 of them.

## ONE DEAD, 2 INJURED IN HARTFORD FIRE

Scores of Patients Scared as Flames Sweep Part of Asylum

HARTFORD, Conn., July 4.—One man is dead, two others were injured and scores of patients badly frightened when fire swept through a part of the Hartford retreat for the insane Saturday.

Charles Booth, of New Britain, was suffocated by the smoke before firemen could reach him. Property damage is estimated at \$8,000. The fire started in the men's ward on the first floor of the building and while it spread rapidly, it was confined to that section. The firemen found it difficult to fight the blaze because of the heavy bars across the windows. The patients were rescued from a heat by a Florida East Coast freight train crew. The crew were reported to be en route to Miami on board the freight train.
