

STRAIGHT TALK BY SIR HENRY WILSON

London, June 2.—(Correspondence of Associated Press)—What was called a "straight talk" was given at the annual meeting of the Union Jack Club by Field-Marshal Sir Henry Wilson, who described himself as "an old soldier who knows what he is talking about."

"We have been told," he said, "that we went into the war to end war. We did not. We went into it to save our skins. We were told that after the war we would have peace, but we have not got it. There are at present between twenty and thirty wars, big and little, going on. We were told that the war should end war, but it did not and could not."

"We are living in ticklish and dangerous times, and our command on sea, on land, and in the air is being challenged in various parts of the world."

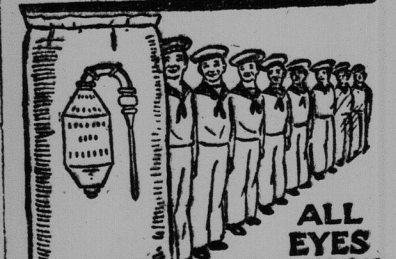
COMMITTEE ENDS VALUABLE WORK
