FERDINAND IS LIVING A VERY CAREFREE LIFE

Spending His Money to Defeat Tax Gatherer — Being Sought for Assistance by Many Would-Be Inventors.

Berlin, Sept. 23.—Former King Ferdinand of Bulgaria, fearing the inroads of the tax gatherer, is enjoying his wealth by spending it.

At Mergentheim, which he is visiting for the sake of the magnesia springs, he leads a jovial and untroubled existence in striking contrast to the cloistered seclusion of the former German Emperor at Amerongen.

Under the name of Count von Murnau, says a writer in the *Zweifel-Urban*, Ferdinand is residing at the Kurhaus together with his suite composed of chaplain, chamberlain, chauffeur, footman, valet and private secretary. His lavish expenditure has made him popular in the town and surrounding country, where the villages see in him and emblem of the "good old times" and greet him with cheers as he drives past in an automobile.

The fact that the British government has released the former King's sequestered property is known to all and has quickly emboldened him to being fabulously rich. His chief purchases are books, bronzes, pictures and jewels. His secretary has a difficult task in keeping off the host of people who want private audiences on business. A chimney-sweep, for instance, has discovered the secret of turning chimney-smoke into high class boot polish and wants King Ferdinand to advance him 3,000 marks for the exploitation of the invention.

Someone also has invented an ever-burning match and he wants money from the King to convert this theory into practice. The secretary has much trouble to make it clear that his master has finally retired from business. Other aspirants to munificence avoid the economically-minded secretary and waylay Ferdinand on his motor excursions.

A man whose ambition in life was to

shake hands with royalty received one day a card ostensibly from the Count von Murnau inviting him to an audience. Overjoyed he hurried to the Kurhaus in frock coat and tall hat. The victim of the hoax did not obtain the longed-for audience, but instead four new 50-mark notes which Ferdinand sent out to him as consolation money.

HUNT NEW DRUGS IN AMAZON BASIN

American Scientists to Explore About 1,000 Miles in Eastern Ecuador and Peru.

A party of American scientists will explore about 1,000 miles of the Amazon basin next year, beginning in January, in search of new drugs and narcotics, according to an announcement by Dr. Henry H. Rusby, dean of the Columbia School of Pharmacy. He is to be the leader of the party, and one of the members will be Dr. David Starr Jordan of Leland Stanford Junior University, who will study fishes and reptiles.

Dr. Rusby said that the expedition was to be called the Mulford Biological Exploration of the Amazon because the financial support was to come mainly from the H. K. Mulford Company of Philadelphia. He said the investigations of the party "would be on a purely scientific basis" and that the general aim would be to make "discoveries of an economic value." Insects and animals are to be studied, as well as

medicinal plants, and photographers will make educational motion pictures. The party will include experts from

Harvard, John Hopkins and the college of Physicians and Surgeons, the Columbia Schools of Pharmacy and other institutions co-operating in investigation of the physical, chemical and clinical properties of drugs. Some of the members are to be Dr. Ed. Kremers of the University of Wisconsin, an authority on volatile oils; Professor Gill of the Boston Institute of Technology, a specialist on fixed oil from seeds; Dr. Ruthven of the University of Michigan, who will study reptiles, and Dr. Eigenman of the American Museum of Natural History also will be in the party.

Dr. Rusby has already made four trips to South America. Before the war he went into southern Colombia to study quinine sources. In 1883 he started a two-year expedition to the Amazon in search of medicinal plants. He explored the Orinoco delta for a colonization company in 1893 and on another expedition he sought new sources of rubber supplies.

"There remains this 1,000-mile tract along Eastern Ecuador and Peru from which no specimen of any kind have ever been secured," Dr. Rusby said.
