EIGHT INDIANS LOSE LIVES IN FOREST FIRES

Regina, Sask., June 3.—Eight Indians were burned to death; two are not expected to recover and four are severely injured and large quantities of provisions, property of the Indians, have been destroyed. This report has reached the Indian commissioner from his agent who was sent to investigate conditions in the country around Cold Lake, several days' journey north of Lloydminster, on the boundary between Saskatchewan and Alberta. Forest fires are given as the cause of loss of lives and property.

BOB MAC GOING TO FREDERICTON

Several more horses are expected to reach the Fredericton trotting park soon to complete their season's training. One of these is Bob Mac, 2:13, the son of Commodore Ledyard, now owned by J. A. Simpson & Sons of Amherst, N. S., and holder of the five-beat record for the maritime provinces. He will be brought here by C. W. Simpson, who has been training him, and will be turned over to Tommy Raymonds, who will drive him in his races.

Bob Mac is to start in the local meeting on Dominion Day and will afterwards be taken to Maine, later returning to the maritime circuit. Driver Baymond's other horses this season include Alice Hal, p. 2:14½, by Direct Hal, 2:04½; Jessie H., p. 2:15½, by Richard Earle, 2:14½; The Manner, 3, 2:26½, a four-year-old trotter by The Exponent, 2:11½, out of Hydrant, 2:14½, by Parole, 2:16; Rilla Hal, by Walnut Hall, 2:08½, and a two-year-old pacing filly by Jesse H., 2:18½, out of Miss Keefer, 2:21½, by Expedition, 2:15½. Miss Keefer dropped another colt by the same sire a short time ago.

CATCHES WIRELESS MESSAGES SENT 4,000 MILES AWAY

St. John's, Nfld., June 4.—Wireless messages sent out by German and Italian land stations nearly 4,000 miles away, were picked up yesterday by the Handley-Page biplane which is being assembled at Harbor Grace for a trans-Atlantic flight in competition for the London Daily Mail's \$50,000 prize.

Reports of a test of the plane's wireless receiving apparatus while the plane was on the ground, were brought here by citizens of St. John's. They said the German and Italian messages could be heard only faintly, but the signals from the station at Clifton, Ireland, were picked up easily.

Trial flights may be made before the

end of this week by both the Handley-Page and the Vickers-Vimy bomb machine.
