Beautiful Hints of Beautiful Models



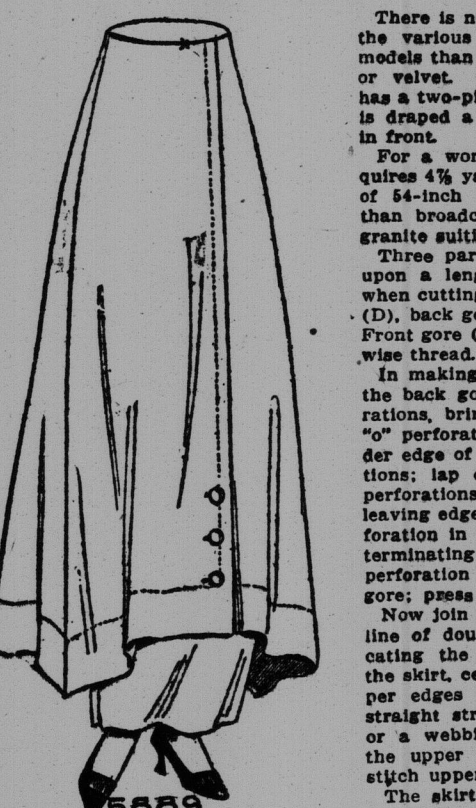
Neil, Bertman

**WEEK-END CABLES TELL
OF TERRIFIC FIGHTING**

Paris, Oct. 25, 11.51 p.m.—The German masses at La Bassee appear, from the desperate efforts which they are making, to be trying to shake themselves loose from the close grip of the Allies, who menace their communications from there and from Armentieres. The intense ardor of the battle was undiminished today. Both armies received reinforcements, but the Allied lines withstood formidable shocks and delivered severe counter-attacks.

The furious nature of the conflict can be gathered from the fact that in front of one British infantry division, in a very small space, over 1,500 German bodies were found after an engagement, while 600 German prisoners were taken by the British in the course of one attack.

La Bassee, which forms a promontory near Lille, is a very important point, covering railroads which the Germans seem determined to capture at whatever cost, but the Allies' resistance hitherto has been too stubborn.

Both sides have suffered terribly. The Black Watch and Royal Irish regiments have been in the thickest of the fighting, and the British casualty list is very great, although much smaller than that of the Germans, who encountered them in solid formation.

There has not been a minute's respite in the conflict since Friday morning, except during the darkest hours of the night, but even then the artillery of both armies kept up a continuous duel.

The battle continues its course with unabated violence near the Belgian coast, and the Germans have been able to force themselves across the Yser, which is a sluggish, shallow river, where the Allies opposed them with a strong defence along every foot of the ground. Of the battle on the centre and left a wing the German report does not speak, but the French declare they are maintaining their positions in the Argonne and on the heights of the Meuse, and have destroyed three more German batteries. From unofficial sources it is learned that the French have made some advance in the mountains along the Alsace border.

In Poland a very heavy battle is now in progress between the fortresses of Ivangorod and Radom, where the Germans and Austrians, who were defeated in their first attempt to cross the Vistula before the former city, have made a stand against the Russians, who have followed in the hope of destroying them.

In London is announced the sinking of a German submarine off the Dutch coast by the British destroyer Badger.

London, Oct. 25.—The Sunday Observer prints a despatch sent by a correspondent in the department of Pas De Calais, France, saying that through the cutting of the dykes in the low country south-east of Dixmude a large German force has been flooded out.

Some estimates place the German losses there at five thousand drowned, besides thirty thousand killed and wounded. This may give some hint, the despatch adds, as to what is meant when it is declared that the fighting in this region is the most desperate of the entire war thus far.

Hints for the Cook

Lemon Dumplings

One-half pound bread crumbs, 1/2 pound of suet chopped fine, 2 ounces of sugar, juice and grated rind of 1 lemon and 2 eggs beaten. Mix and make into eight dumplings. Boil one hour.

Genevieve's Birthday Cake

Cream smooth 2 cups of butter, 4 cups of sugar. Beat the yolks of 10 eggs until thick, add to butter and sugar and stir in 2 cups of milk, 4 cups of flour and 2 cups of cornstarch which has been sifted 4 times with 5 level teaspoons of baking powder. When mixed add 2 teaspoons of vanilla and the whites of 10 eggs beaten stiff and dry. Bake in a round pan. When cold cover with icing and decorate.
