

By August 1, 1923, the world's supply of all kinds of cotton will amount to only 6,651,000 bales, according to the U. S. department of commerce in their third world cotton summary issued Monday. This is an abnormally low total, being 8,000,000 bales less than the world cotton stocks on hand August 1, 1921. The above estimate for next August includes only 2,775,000 bales of American cotton, as compared with 6,500,000 bales on hand two years ago. These figures indicate that consumption of cotton has been much greater than production in the 1921-1922 and 1922-1923 seasons. In fact, since August 1, 1921, the world has been consuming cotton at the annual rate of more than 20,000,000 bales, while the total production in the 1921 growing season was only 14,741,000 bales and in 1922 only 17,664,000 bales. World consumption of American cotton in the last two years has been at the annual rate of more than 12½ million bales, while production has been at the average rate of not quite nine million bales a year.
