Outport Citizens for Upper House

There are several vacancies in the Legislative Council at present, and The Guardian advocates and recommends the appointment of some resident outport citizens to fill the vacancies.

At the present time all the members of the Legislative Council are residents of one place—St. John's. We are fully cognizant of the opinions of large numbers of city folk that St. John's is "it" in Newfoundland, but really we believe the outport people should assert themselves a little more than they do and let the city folk know that the outports are awake.

We are so self-satisfied and easy-going that we don't seem to worry no matter how things go. And the wonder is that things in Newfoundland are not far worse than they are.

We would suggest to our outport contemporaries (not that we think it will have any effect) to join with us in advocating for outport citizens to be appointed to fill the vacancies in the Legislative Council.

We also agree with a city contemporary when it says that Hon. Dr. Skelton should be appointed president of that chamber.

Look to Ourselves

If the people living in the towns and settlements outside St. John's want their rights or any attention paid to their requests, they have got to join hands and help themselves by taking definite action together.

As far as we can see, neither governments nor the local representatives (there are a few exceptions) take any deep or practical interest in the welfare or the needs of the people whose representatives they are supposed to be.

The outport people have thought that the St. John's newspapers were interested in their welfare, but this has been largely a delusion. Generally speaking, the outport people have been always ready to support anything emanating from the capital, but what have they received in return? Nothing more than the crumbs. Oh, for a spirit of outport patriotism. Oh, for a strong public outport opinion and sentiment. When this comes there will be something doing, but not before.

We want to tell the outport people that the St. John's members look after the interests of their constituents in a very creditable manner. In the Legislature and outside they are continually interesting themselves in District matters. We wish we could say the same of all outport representatives.

American Battleship Gets Trials

Washington, Feb. 5.—The new monster super-dreadnought U.S.S. Pennsylvania, one of the most powerful battleships afloat, began her trials off the Maine coast.

The Pennsylvania displaces 31,400 tons, is 608 feet over all, 97 feet in breadth and will, if she fulfills her contract agreement, be capable of developing 31 knots. Her main battery consists of twelve 14 inch guns in four turrets, and four submerged torpedo boats.

Bomb on Steamer

Bordeaux, Feb. 7.—A small metal tube supposed to be a bomb has been found on the British steamship Hannington, which arrived here last Friday flour laden from New York. The tube was concealed among some sacks of flour where it was thought to have been placed after the steamer left New York. A strict investigation is being made.

Germans Perish

It is a sorry spectacle when men lose faith in one another. Only a few days ago a case in point happened. The crew of a British trawler sighted 20 Germans clinging to a wrecked Zeppelin airship floating in the North Sea. The Germans asked to be taken off, but the trawler's crew, knowing themselves to be outnumbered by the Germans, and also knowing the awful brutal crimes perpetrated by them, would not take any chances and left the Germans to their fate.

The trawler's crew however sailed to port and informed the naval authorities who sent ships to search for the Germans, but a storm came on and those on the airship no doubt perished—because the Britishers had no faith in them—could not trust them.

The aircraft was no doubt returning from the air-raid to England, after dropping bombs on undefended towns and killed 61 innocent men, women and children.

Mr. M. W. Furlong, K. C., Solicitor of the House of Assembly and a Director of the Reid Nfld. Co., died at Montreal Tuesday night.

The Nfld. Patriotic Assn. have decided to raise two more battalions for service at the front, and an active campaign with this as its object will be undertaken shortly.

Copenhagen despatch says a large German warship has been sunk in the Cattegat supposed to have struck a mine.

The Dominion police have arrested at Wingham, Ontario, Adolphe Schutte, an alleged German agent. The New York Herald says that the Canadian Secret Service has uncovered numerous prophecies, the principal object of which was the invasion of Canada and the destruction of the Welland Canal.

Messages from eneva say, Gaecording to private messages received there that a large aerodrome outside Berlin, together with 6 or 9 new aeroplanes, have been destroyed.
