While it is yet a couple of feet below last year's highest point, from the vast quantities of snow in the mountains, some of which has fallen within the last few days, there is little doubt that it will go higher than in 1897. The Canadian Pacific railway and the International Paper Co. are already floating at a high elevation, while the Kaslo and Slokan railway slanting dock is almost completely under water. A few days ago the freight tracks were submerged and now water covers the passenger tracks in front of the depot. Kaslo river rose a foot in one day, lowered again with a change of weather, and now once more the rushing torrent is getting higher each day. Thus far no serious damage has been done by high water so far as known, but the generally rising flood is being watched carefully, and hopes are expressed that it will soon begin to recede for the season.

THE COAL LOADING RECORD. The Titania Takes 5,800 Tons in 16 1/2 Hours. It became whispered around on Saturday that it was the intention of the management of the New Vancouver Coal Company to break the record in the loading of the monster collier, Titania. The result shows most clearly that the goal aimed at was reached, but like Alexander of old, who wanted more words to conquer, the management is determined to make another conquest by capturing at least four hours from the crack record of Saturday last. The steam collier Titania arrived on Saturday morning about 5 o'clock and at 11 o'clock that night was steaming away towards California. In the short space of 16 1/2 hours the New Vancouver Coal company loaded 5,800 tons of Nanaimo's superior "Black Diamonds" into the collier. The previous record stood at 22 hours, so that the Saturday effort made a reduction of 3 1/2 hours. Mr. S. M. Robins, superintendent, Mr. W. C. McGregor, manager, together with the officials and employees of the company, are to be congratulated on the commendable record of their skill and labor—Nanaimo Free Press.
