

The annual report of the executive committee, including the treasurer's account, was read as follows:

WINDSOR, N. S., 29th June, 1892.

The Executive Committee of the Alumni of King's College, Windsor, on their 45th Anniversary submit the following:

REPORT.

1. They have the pleasure of announcing that the Rev. Dyson Hague, Rector of St. Paul's, Halifax, has kindly consented to deliver the Alumni oration at the Encenia to-morrow.

2. The Treasurer's account for the year ended 30th April, duly audited, and showing a balance in hand of \$361.29, is submitted herewith.

3. Two governors of the College are to be elected in place of Dr. Henry Youle Hind, and Rev. Dr. Ambrose, who go out of office under section 3, cap. 66, acts of 1853.

4. Under by-law IV, the Vice-President goes out of office.

5. Under the same by-law the Rev. J. O. Ruggles, Messrs. R. J. Wilson, and H. P. Scott, retire from the Executive committee.

6. The committee are pleased to learn, and to inform the Alumni of the continued success of the Church School for Girls.

7. (a) A communication having been received from the Governors on the financial position of the College, suggesting the sending of an agent to England to collect funds for the College, and asking the co-operation of the Alumni, your committee commend the subject to your favorable consideration. (b)—In addition to this recommendation the committee would suggest the prospective benefit from the active employment of the faculty during recess in the interests of the institution.

8. The Governors having further informed your committee that they have felt constrained, in consequence of the state of the finances, to reduce the staff of professors, and asked the hearty co-operation of the Alumni at this critical juncture of affairs, your committee regret that the Board of Governors have felt themselves called upon to dispense with the services of one of the Professors, and *especially*, that the chair *selected* should have been the one which the Alumni from the time of their organization have considered of the greatest importance, and in which they have taken the deepest interest by their contributing so large a portion of their funds to its maintenance. The committee commend the subject to the serious consideration of this meeting, and trust that the Alumni may see their way to take such steps in co-operation with the Governors as will place the finances of the College on a sound and satisfactory basis.
