**WHAT THE HAZEN GOVERNMENT HAS SAVED TO THE PEOPLE BY THE CHEAPER SCHOOL BOOKS**  
 Another Question Which the Opposition Critics Do Not Dare to Discuss -- How the "School Book Ring" was Smashed to the Everlasting Benefit of the Province.

Fredericton, March 21.—The opposition are not saying much these days about school book prices. Occasionally they touch upon the theme lightly, and venture some asinine criticism, but their objections to the government's school book policy lacks the vehemence, that fury, that seeming sincerity which formerly characterized their utterances on this very important subject.

And no wonder. The longer the school book policy is tried out the more satisfactory does it prove to be in every regard. Not only has a very large sum of money been saved to the people of New Brunswick by reason of the Hazen government smashing the "school book ring," but the public schools saved forty per cent. on all books they have to buy; but the provincial secretary was able to announce the other day that reducing next school term a further reduction would be made in school book prices.

The reason why the lowest price was not possible this year and last year and the year before was because the school octopus had its tentacles so deeply and so tenaciously into the pockets of the people that it has taken nearly four years of strenuous effort to release the people of the province from that blood-sucking grasp. How the School Book Ring Fattened.

It is only now that the people can begin to form any definite idea of the amount of tribute the common people were compelled to pay to the Flood school book monopoly, under the arrangement made with them by the government and Mr. Robinson and his predecessors.

The exact extent of the monopoly's rake-off will never be known. The common people of the province paid into the school book department in the year 1910 the sum of \$17,162.92; and in the years 1909 and 1910 no less than \$28,323, and those prices were at the 40 per cent. reduction. Had prices exacted by the Flood trust prevailed those school books would have cost parents \$11,333 more, or a total of \$39,716.

Flood's rake-off of 15 per cent.—and that is what they got on every dollar's worth of school books sold in the province, whether they had anything to do with handling them or not—would have amounted to \$5,977.40, which shows that for many years that grasping monopoly had been dipping into the pockets of the country people down said rivers and streams, and to do all things necessary for the efficient operation of said work and incidental thereto.

ment of the total expenses of the department for since its inception in 1908 and in that statement of expenses is included every item of salaries, freight, postage, office supplies, and the department for proper care and handling of the same. Thousands of books, everything possible that could be charged to the department, and the total is \$48,869.79.

The receipts from sales during the same period and the inventory of books on hand by vendors and at the department, less ten per cent. of the vendors' commission, show that in the whole time the department has been running the net cost to the province has been \$355.34, or one-fourteenth of one per cent. But even better than that showing will be the record for next year, for the department is now self-sustaining by reason of the very small margin of profit made on copy books and others, that sell at three cents and do not cost quite that much in the big lots the government buys.

The school book department is not costing the people of the province one cent now and is saving them at the prices that will prevail commencing next school term, \$10,000 a year, if the people want to go back to the days of the school book ring and be deceived, or do they prefer to have that \$10,000 a year in their own pockets?
